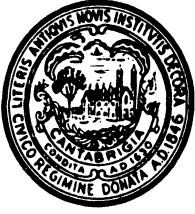

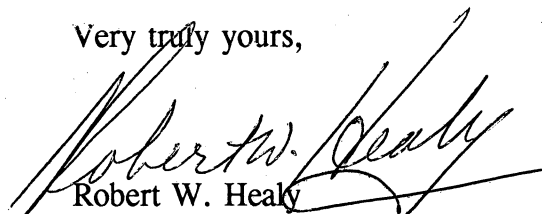

To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report #33 regarding the railroad crossing gate at Gore and Medford Streets, please be advised on the following:

The railroad crossing gate at this location has apparently been knocked down by large tractor trailers entering and exiting the Millbrook Storage company. The curb cut and the part of the street the trailers are using to maneuver into the loading dock is in the City of Somerville, and technically not within Cambridge's jurisdiction. We have, however, spoken to City of Somerville Traffic and Parking officials and written a letter expressing our concerns about the trucks maneuvering in and out of Millbrook Storage, and have called Conrail requesting that the railroad gate be replaced. In addition, the Cambridge Police Department has spoken to the Somerville Police Department about safety concerns in the area. The Cambridge Police Department will provide enforcement in Cambridge, if and when necessary.
