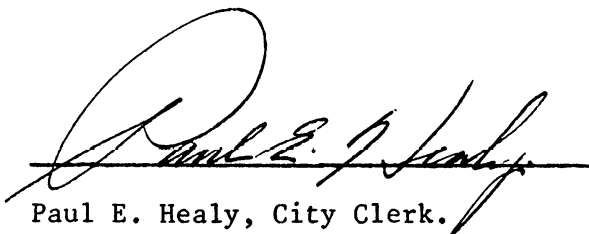

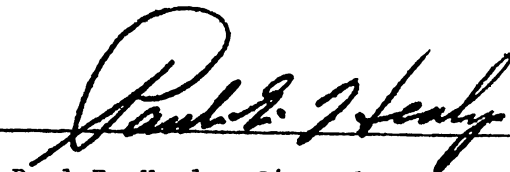
COUNCILLOR WOLF
