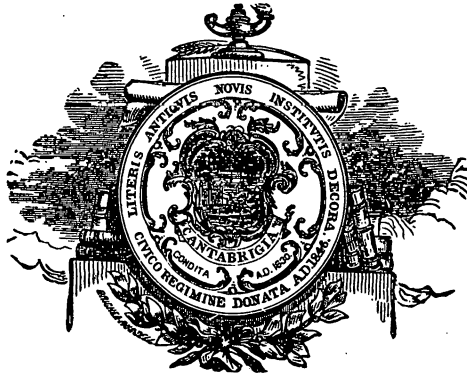

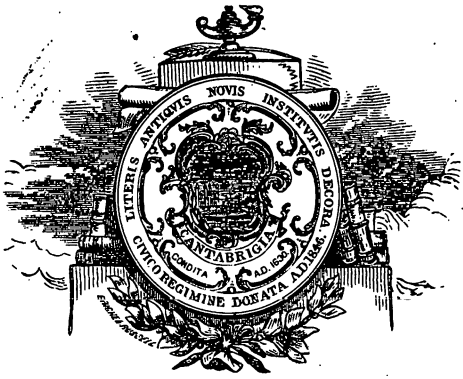

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *McCabe Street, so called, extending from Cambridge Street to Jefferson Street,*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *thirty feet* in width between *Cambridge and Jefferson Streets,*

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *Edwin F. Bowker, Engineer and Surveyor, and dated July 15. 1873.*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,

Ordered,

That the name of said McCabe Street, be changed and that said street be hereafter called, and known as, Marion Street.
