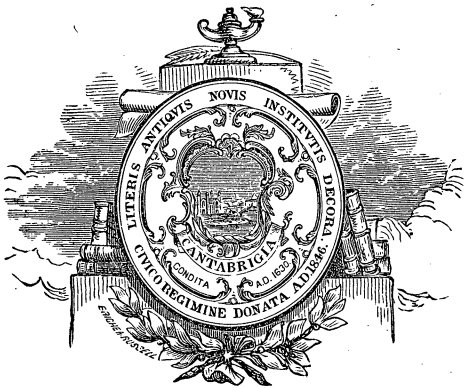

I am requested by the Committee on Roads and Bridges to inquire if you will sign a release of Webster Avenue between Plymouth Street and the northerly line of your estate. A petition of C. E. Raymond and others for the acceptance of Webster Avenue is now before the City Council, and if the abutters will sign it will hasten the matter. It appears from a plan now on file in the City Engineer's office that about 230 feet of land included within your fence line, belongs to the street, and is needed to straighten the line.

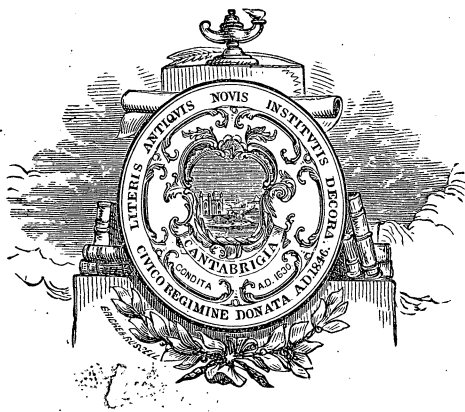
