To the Honorable, the City Council:

George F. Mullett, a former member of the City Council, died October 12, 1938. At that time the matter of taking official action on his death was overlooked.

I am now calling the attention of your honorable body to his public service. He was an old and respected citizen of Cambridge who served his country and his fellow citizens faithfully and well. He was a United Spanish War veteran who served his country in the year 1898; and during the years 1917-18-19 and 20 he was a member of the City Council. During both of these periods he rendered capable and efficient service. Such service as he rendered is deserving of recognition.

I therefor respectfully recommend that suitable action be taken by your honorable body as a tribute of respect to his memory in which action I shall, of course, join.

Notice has been received from His Honor, the Mayor, of the death of George F. Mullett on October 12, 1938, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of the sad event.

A life-long resident of Cambridge, Mr. Mullett had the interest of his native city at heart and took an active part in politics being a Councillor from old Ward 4 during the years 1917 - 1920, at which time he served on most of the important committees. Mr. Mullett was a printer by trade and for many years was associated with the Cambridge Chronicle.

He possessed a great love for his country and welcomed the opportunity to serve in the Spanish American War. Later he became Commander of the Leslie F. Hunting Camp 12, United Spanish War Veterans, and was always an enthusiastic and ardent worker in the organization.

A gentle man, genuine, uneffected and sincere, he will long be remembered as a friend of the less fortunate. It is therefore

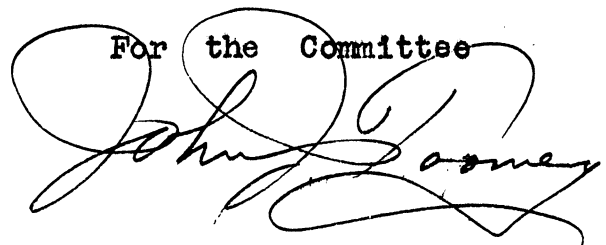
