

WHEREAS: Ulysses has been involved with many civic, religious and veterans' organizations, such as the Isaac Wilson Taylor Post #2443 where he served as Commander, and he has served as Chaplain for Cambridge veteran organizations. Ulysses has also been instrumental with the following activities: instituted first I.W. Taylor Memorial Service parade, elected Junior Vice Commander Middlesex County Council, served on Parade Committee for National Convention held in Boston, Chief Marshall for Massachusetts Division, elected Senior Vice Commander Middlesex County Council, elected Commander Middlesex County Council, elected President of Cambridge Veterans' Organization, instituted "Voice of Democracy" Essay Program at C.H.L.S., programs placing MIA flags in schools and visiting Cambridge Public Schools with American flags, and procuring World War II monument and planting the Eisenhower Tree at Cambridge Cemetery; and Ulysses is also active in the Saint Cyprian Church in Boston and the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record dedicating the location at the corner of Field and Chilton Streets as

Ulysses H. Gore Square;

and be it further

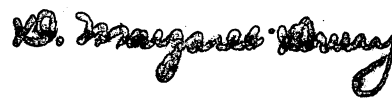

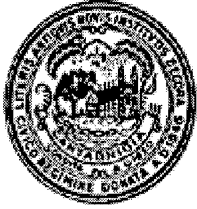

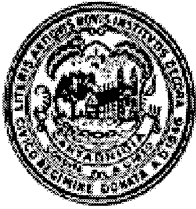
WHEREAS: On July 5, 1918, Joseph Franklin and Georgianna (McCullough) Gore were blessed with the birth of their son, Ulysses Hanson Gore, who was born at 154 Pleasant Street, Cambridge, MA; and

WHEREAS: The family moved after Ulysses' birth to 18 Pine Street. Ulysses attended the Boardman and Roberts Schools. Ulysses was a graduate of Cambridge High and Latin School Class of 1935; and

WHEREAS: Ulysses served his country proudly during World War II, he enlisted in the Army in 1942 and received an honorable discharge as a Sergeant in 1946. Ulysses' career with the United States Government covered forty-two years where he worked at the Boston Naval Shipyard and later at Hanscom Air Force Base. Ulysses retired in 1984; and

WHEREAS: In 1946, Ulysses purchased 19 Field Street, Cambridge, and this residence has been his home ever since. On December 12, 1954, Ulysses and Ruth Reed Gore were married and this union, which has lasted for forty-nine years, has been blessed with three daughters, Leslie, Traci and Wendi, seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren; and

WHEREAS: Ulysses attended Calvin Coolidge College and Portia Law School, and received a Bachelor of Arts degree; and
