- WHEREAS: Cities across the country have planned activities to celebrate National Arts Week and to commemorate a week designed to focus the public's attention on the arts in various communities; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Arts Council, eager to participate actively in National Arts Week, is encouraging the public to attend local cultural events, including: the art exhibit in City Hall "Making a Difference", a visual and oral history exhibit, funded by the Arts Council, which features collage pages created by the students in the Just-A-Start program during artist Laura Blacklow's residency; Longy School of Music's Septemberfest Celebration, a concert of Wind music on September 26; the Boston Quartet's performance on September 27 as part of the MIT Chapel Series; and in the Arts Council's Gallery 57 group exhibition of Cambridge artists selected to exhibit their work in the gallery during the 1990-91 exhibition year; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council proclaims the period from September 23-29, 1990 to be Cambridge Arts Week, and urges the people of Cambridge to take advantage of the events planned by the Cambridge Arts Council and other Cambridge arts organizations; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be forwarded to the Cambridge Arts Council, 57 Inman Street, Cambridge, MA 02139.
