VICE MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: There are reports from residential streets around the City that large truck traffic is increasing; and
- WHEREAS: In these areas, feel the impact of safety issues, noise, and violations causing cracks in walls and foundations; and
- WHEREAS: It seems that there may be changes in traffic patterns, lack of signage, or other reasons that are causing this disturbance, now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager request the Traffic Department to analyze the patterns of large truck traffic and take those steps necessary to reduce the problem, trying to keep trucks on main streets; prevent them from cutting through residential streets; and be it further
- ORDERED: That strong enforcement of low regulating trucks be instituted, an activity that would increase safety and probably pay for itself and; be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the City Council on measures taken and what additional steps the Council might take to alleviate this situation.
