Barney Kahn, 98;
Malden jeweler

Barney Kahn, a prominent jeweler in Malden where he was known as "Dean of the Merchants," died Thursday at Glen Ridge Nursing Home in Medford after a long illness. He was 98.

Almost 95 years ago, Mr. Kahn made the trip to Ellis Island from Russia with his family, immigrating to Malden. Mr. Kahn sold newspapers to earn money as a teenager and went on to be an apprentice in the Jeweler's Building in Boston, working nights at a nearby restaurant for additional income.

Mr. Kahn was honored in 1989 by Boy Scouts of America, Minuteman Council, as Malden's Distinguished Citizen. He was a member of the Malden Kiwanis Club, and a former director of the Chamber of Commerce and a lifetime member of the Malden YMCA.

A leader in the Jewish community, Mr. Kahn served many years as a member of the Suffolk Square Association and was a founder of Temple Tifereth Israel. He was a charter member of the local B'nai B'rith Chapter.

He leaves a daughter, Charlotte Ettinger of Weston; two sons, Arthur of Malden and David of Medford; a sister, Eva Levine of Florida; and seven grandchildren and several great-grandchildren, including WCVB-TV news anchor Heather Kahn.
