IN CITY COUNCIL  
November 18, 1991

- WHEREAS: Our community faces increased hunger and homelessness in the lives of its most vulnerable citizens; and
- WHEREAS: Our city resolves that the alleviation of such shortages of food and housing is paramount in its responsibility of governing; and
- WHEREAS: Our community supports the right of every Cambridge citizen to adequate food and housing; and
- WHEREAS: Housing and food are fundamental human needs and rights, not the privilege, of every individual; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Economic Opportunity Committee, Cambridge Clergy for Affordable Housing, the Cambridge Food Pantry Network, the Black Pastors' Conference, the Central Square Clergy Association, and the Harvard Square Ministerial Association have joined together in calling for a city-wide "week" of action, reflection, and education; and
- WHEREAS: The week shall focus on new initiatives to remedy the shortages which create hunger and homelessness; and
- WHEREAS: All members of our community are invited to participate, whether governmental, corporate, business, individuals, or institutional, to promote resources for the victims of the food and housing shortage in our community; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council declares November 17-28, 1991 as "HUNGER/HOMELESS/HOUSING WEEK: Feeding the Hungry--Housing the Homeless;" and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby call on all businesses, corporations, churches, and individuals to aid in the provision of food and housing resources for our most vulnerable neighbors; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That all residents and city employees are hereby urged to participate in the Mayor's food drive by bringing canned goods and staples to the collection center in City Hall.
