Whereas,

In the opinion of this Board the public necessity and convenience require that Winsor Street should be extended, and laid out from its present southerly terminus, across Main Street to a private way called State Street, by taking for such purpose, certain parcels of land shown in a plan ^{dated Dec. 5. 1886,} prepared by the City Engineer, to wit, a strip of land forty feet in width between said Main Street and said State Street, the western boundary thereof to begin at the north-easterly corner of the brick block, standing on the southerly side of said Main Street, and thence to extend southerly along the easterly line of said block, at right angles with said Main Street, and in a straight line in extension of said easterly line of said block to said State Street. Such extension and laying out to be made under the provisions of law authorizing the assessment of betterments.

It is therefore hereby

Ordered,

That due notice be given to the owner and abutters on the line of said extension, and all other persons interested that this Board intends to extend and lay out said street ^{said land and laying out} by taking the same as a public street; and that Wednesday, the 14th day of December next at 8 o'clock P.M. is assigned as the time for hearing any objections that may be made thereby.
