Whereas the City Council reaffirmed this invitation by resolution dated 1 April 1974;

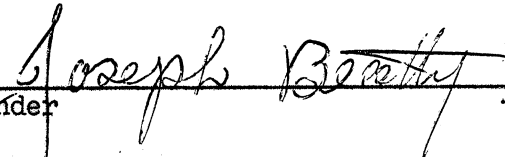
Whereas the Kennedy Library will be an asset to the City and the people of Cambridge;
