

The Committee on Engineering, to which was referred the Petition of William A. Saunders for the grade of a new street which he and others proposed to lay out, and at some future time to ask the City to accept, have considered the same, and would respectfully report that they do not consider it a part of the City Engineer's duty, to survey or give grades for streets, upon private lands, but think when such streets are laid out of proper width and the City asked to accept them in accordance with the City regulations, then and not till then, it would be required of the City, to give the grade and lines of such streets; and the Committee would therefore recommend that the Petitioners have leave to withdraw
