

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

An Ordinance,

in addition to an "Ordinance, establishing a system of accountability in the expenditures of the City".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. All City Officers, who shall, in their official capacity, receive any money on behalf of the City, shall pay to the Treasurer the amount in their hands, once in three months, and oftener if required, except the Collector of Taxes, who shall make such payment whenever the sum in his hands shall amount to five hundred dollars. All other persons, who shall have money in their hands belonging to the City, shall forthwith pay the same to the Treasurer; who shall, on the first day of every month, make out a written statement of all his receipts, as Treasurer, for the preceding month, stating in detail the several amounts, the names of the persons of whom, and on what account, the same were received; which statement shall be delivered to the City Clerk, to be by him presented to the City Council at their next meeting.

2. All City Officers and Agents, receiving money on behalf of the City, shall

deliver to the City Clerk, once in three months, a report in detail, of the amount received, and what disposition has been made thereof, except in cases otherwise provided.

3. The ninth and tenth sections of an Ordinance, establishing a system of accountability in the expenditures of the City, passed on the twenty-fifth day of May, 1846, are hereby repealed.
