WHEREAS: The CambridgeSide Galleria JOB FAIR on August 13 & 14, 1990, sponsored by The Cambridge Employment Program through Employment Resources, Inc., Cambridge Community Development Department and New England Development, was a significant opportunity for Cambridge residents to be hired to fill the much advertised 1,000 job openings; and

WHEREAS: It is essential that we have a real handle on the outcome of that JOB FAIR and on the employee-hiring procedures of all the businesses at the Galleria both now and as it builds out to completion and full occupancy so far as the number of Cambridge residents hired from among those who have applied for employment is concerned; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager request The Cambridge Employment Program to provide this Council, by mid-October, 1990, with a factual breakdown of how many of the 1,000 job openings were filled during the JOB FAIR and, of those filled, how many were filled with Cambridge residents. Further, that the City Manager request The Cambridge Employment Program to provide this Council, on a bi-monthly basis until the entire CambridgeSide Galleria is fully operative, with the total number of employees hired during the interim and the precise number of Cambridge residents among those employees.
