MAYOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS:** There is and has been for many years a sizeable Portuguese segment of the Cambridge population, a segment that has contributed greatly to the rich history of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS:** Despite their prominent role and contribution there presently is no public building or structure named for a Portuguese veteran; and
- WHEREAS:** The new Cambridge Fire Station being constructed at Second and Cambridge Streets is situated in a sizeable Portuguese neighborhood; and
- WHEREAS:** The Carvalho family of Cambridge has sacrificed two of its members in serving our country, Benedict M. Carvalho, USN, killed in action in 1943 and Firefighter, George A. Carvalho who died in 1971 of injuries sustained in the line of duty; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby urge this City Council to go on record as requesting that the new Cambridge Fire Station be named in honor of these unselfish and outstanding citizens.
