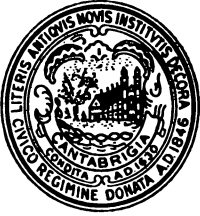

To the Honorable, the City Council:

Please be advised that I have just been advised by James B. Hartgering, M. D., Commissioner of Health, Hospital and Welfare, that the U. S. Department of Agriculture has awarded a grant in the sum of \$391,100 to the Pediatrics Department of the Cambridge Hospital to provide supplemental foods to infants, children less than four years old, and pregnant and lactating women. This program, which provides foods such as infant formula, cereals, whole milk, eggs and fruit juices, will be available to all age-appropriate enrollees of the Cambridge Hospital Neighborhood Health Centers.

A voucher system will be utilized as the means of food distribution. It is anticipated that this program will be inaugurated early in 1974 and will run until June 31, 1974, at which time availability of additional federal funds will dictate the possible continuation of the program.

It is to be stressed that this grant is finite in duration and will expire on June 31, 1974.

Dr. Philip Porter, Chief of the Pediatrics Department, will be present at this meeting to answer any questions which your Honorable Body might have on this same program.
