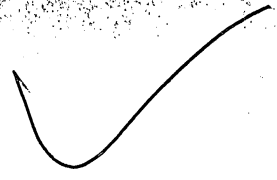

Kostantinos Kapsalis, Cambridge restaurateur

Kostantinos "Charles" Kapsalis of Arlington, the owner of Bigelow Restaurant in Cambridge, died Tuesday at Youville Hospital in Cambridge. He was 84.

Born in Asia Minor, he emigrated to New York City in 1935 and moved to the Boston area after his marriage.

Mr. Kapsalis operated the Bigelow Restaurant near City Hall from 1950 until he retired in 1986.

He was a well-known face in Cambridge, serving several generations of politicians, students and ordinary citizens.

He was a member of the

Hesperia Lodge of the Masons for more than 50 years and a member of St. Athanasius Church in Arlington.

Mr. Kapsalis was the husband of the late Mary (Ski-gis). He is survived by his wife, Eugenia (Pappas) of Arlington; two sons, Steven of Cambridge and John of Boston; four grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at 11 a.m. tomorrow at St. Athanasius Church.
