MetroNet was previously granted certificates to provide the services in New Bedford, Fall River, Falmouth, Agawam, Orleans, Boston, Warren, South Middleboro, Hingham, Framingham, Georgetown, Brockton and Boylston, Massachusetts.

The above investigation is officially captioned:

Application of MetroNet, Inc., under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General Laws, as amended, for a certificate as a Radio Utility, for the operation of a Mobile Radio Utility System for compensation within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
