Sirs:

I respectfully request an Exemption Certificate from the Leash Law for my two dogs.

Reasons:

1. City Dog Officer unable to control unleashed dogs.
2. City has no strong commitment to see that the law is enforced.
3. The Clerk of Court's Office refused to accept my last case and effectively barred me from any further action.
 1. Chief Justice Samuel E. Zoll who was forwarded the complaint by the Attorney General's Office has not yet resolved the problem.
4. My physical condition makes it impossible to withstand the continued pulling on my arms and body. I have really suffered enough.
5. As a citizen, I have taken many personal initiatives to solve the problem and have been unsuccessful. I already go out of the city at night with my dogs. I feel that I have made every effort to comply with the law and to encourage others to do so. Therefore, any further compliance on my part can not be expected by you. Spring is coming and the problem will naturally pick up.

Due to the above list of reasons, I think the law is placing a severe hardship on me and request exemption from same.
