Report of Committee
on Watering Streets
Dec. 14. 1864

City of Cambridge.

In board of Aldermen, Dec. 14th 1864.

The joint standing Committee
now watering streets have attended to
the duties pertaining to said office
and would respectfully report the
action of the same as follows -

The City having appropriated
two thousand dollars for the purpose above
mentioned, the Committee advertised
for contributions by the citizens for
the purpose of watering the streets of Cambridge
during the season just past -

There was subscribed by the citizens
the sum of thirty one hundred dollars
fifty six dollars. - Making the prop-
ortion to the amount appropriated by the
City - sixty two and three tenths per
cent of the whole - leaving a small
provisional balance for incidental expenses.

A contract was made with
John C. Stiles to water the streets in district
one, and a portion of district two, receiv-
ing therefor the same, the amount subscrib-
ed in said district and part of district
and as corresponding proportion of the
City appropriation for those purposes.

WATERING STREETS

CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

An Ordinance in relation to Watering Streets.

SECT. 1. Whenever an appropriation of money shall have been made by the City Council for watering streets, no part of said appropriation shall be expended, except by order of the Committee on Watering Streets, and upon a warrant drawn by the Mayor upon the City Treasurer and duly countersigned by the Auditor.

SECT. 2. Such sum only shall be paid for watering any streets as shall be equal to the amount subscribed by persons residing on said street.

SECT. 3. The Committee on Watering Streets shall, in all cases, make the contract with some suitable person or persons for watering any street or streets, where an amount equal to one half the expense thereof shall first have been subscribed and paid into the hands of the Chairman of said Committee; but no money shall be paid from said appropriation for any watering not done in pursuance of a contract so made.

All persons who desire to avail themselves of provisions contained in the above Ordinance for Watering Streets, can do so by placing their subscriptions in the hands of the Committee on or before the 2d day of May.
