A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS:

The Massachusetts House of Representatives has forwarded a resolution to the State Supreme Court asking for a delay on the imposition of revaluation on the Cities and Towns of Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS:

The Great and General Court has taken the first step to amend the law under which the Supreme Court has acted; and

WHEREAS:

It appears that the law will definitely be changed by 1978; and

WHEREAS:

The great majority of the Cities of Massachusetts are not subject to the same Court order that affects Cambridge and therefore will not revalue by 1978; and

WHEREAS:

This would appear that this order discriminates against our City; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council and City Manager respectfully request The Supreme Court to take affirmative action on the request of The House of Representatives to declare a moratorium on revaluation until the results of a State-wide referendum is determined.


