CAMBRIDGE, January 10, 1888.

WHEREAS :

By a resolve approved December 29, 1887, certain parcels of land, therein described, were taken for the extension of Winsor Street, from Main Street to State Street, and the same were laid out as a public street or way of the City of Cambridge, to wit : Beginning on the southerly line of Main Street, at a point nearly opposite the easterly end of the brick block, now or late of Moses A. Dow, and thence extending by a line at right angles with the said southerly line of Main Street, and passing at a distance of one-tenth of a foot from the southeast corner of said brick block a distance of one hundred and eighty-seven and ninety-eight one-hundredths (187.98) linear feet to State Street ; thence running easterly on the northerly line of State Street, a distance of forty (40) feet ; thence turning and running northerly by a line parallel with and forty (40) feet distant from the first described line of such extension a distance of one hundred and eighty-seven and ninety-one one-hundredths (187.91) linear feet to Main Street, thence running westerly on the southerly line of Main street forty (40) feet to the point of beginning. It is therefore

Ordered,

That due notice be given to the following persons, to wit :

HEIRS OF MOSES A. DOW,
HEIRS OF SAMUEL WOODWARD,

and all other persons interested as owners, proprietors, tenants, occupants, or otherwise, in said land, that they cut off, pull down, remove and carry away all buildings, erections and obstructions of every sort standing on and projecting over the lines of said extension of Winsor Street as established by the resolve aforesaid ; or move and set back the same to the said lines, and vacate and surrender the land and premises taken as aforesaid on or before the second day of April, now next ensuing ;

And in default thereof, said city will forthwith enter upon said land, and cause all buildings, erections and obstructions, standing on and projecting over the lines of said Winsor Street, as established by the resolve aforesaid, to be cut off, pulled down, removed and carried away, or sold in such manner as it shall deem expedient, or to be moved and set back to said lines, and the said land to be vacated and surrendered to said city.

By order of the BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

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And in default thereof, said city will forthwith enter upon said land, and cause all buildings, erections and obstructions, standing on and projecting over the lines of said Winsor Street, as established by the resolve aforesaid, to be cut off, pulled down, removed and carried away, or sold in such manner as it shall deem expedient, or to be moved and set back to said lines, and the said land to be vacated and surrendered to said city.
