The Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges to which was referred the petition of Margaret Finnigan that further compensation may be made to her, for the damage done to her estate, on Broadway, corner of Winsor Street, Would respectfully Report: that they have heard the petitioner, and that she has laid before your Committee proper vouchers for expenditures to an amount of upwards of \$3300. including the loss of rent of said premises during the time of making the alterations rendered necessary by the act of the City. and that only \$2000. damages was awarded to her. And your Committee

would recommend that an additional award of one thousand dollars be made to the said Margaret Finnigan the same to be in full for all damages she has or may have against the City of Cambridge for the widening of Broadway. And they would recommend the passage of the accompanying Order.
