



That Chapter Twenty-Three entitled: "Regulations Pertaining to Controlled Rental Housing Units" is hereby amended by repealing Section 2 thereof, entitled: "Rent Control Ombuds-person," which reads as follows:

**Section 2. Rent Control Ombudsperson.**

(a) **Establishment.** The Rent Control Department shall employ an Ombudsperson. The Ombudsperson shall be furnished with office space and necessary clerical assistance, to be determined by the Rent Control Department. The Ombudsperson shall be paid a salary to be determined by the City Manager, subject to appropriation.

(b) **Appointment.** The City Manager and the Rent Control Board shall jointly agree to and appoint, and may so remove, the Ombudsperson.

(c) **Powers and Duties.** The Ombudsperson shall, under the supervision and direction of the Executive Director of the Rent Control Department:

- (1) provide expert legal and accounting assistance to parties with business before the Board;
- (2) coordinate advice and information given to the public by the department;
- (3) prepare publications which explain the rights and remedies of landlords and tenants in easily understandable language;
- (4) receive informal complaints from the public concerning Board and staff procedures, and advise the Executive Director;
- (5) compile and index by subject matter decisions of the Board;
- (6) investigate administrative problems and recommend remedies to the Executive Director; and
- (7) in general, facilitate communications between the Board and the public.

The text of the Zoning Ordinance would be amended by creating six new zoning districts as identified above and modifying certain regulations as noted below:

Subsection 11.82 of Section 11.80, Employment Plan Compliance Procedure, would be amended to include the Cambridgeport Revitalization District.

A new section 11.90, Low and Moderate Income Housing, is proposed which outlines special regulations for certain higher density residential developments in the Res. C-1B district. It requires a percentage of low and moderate income housing to be provided.

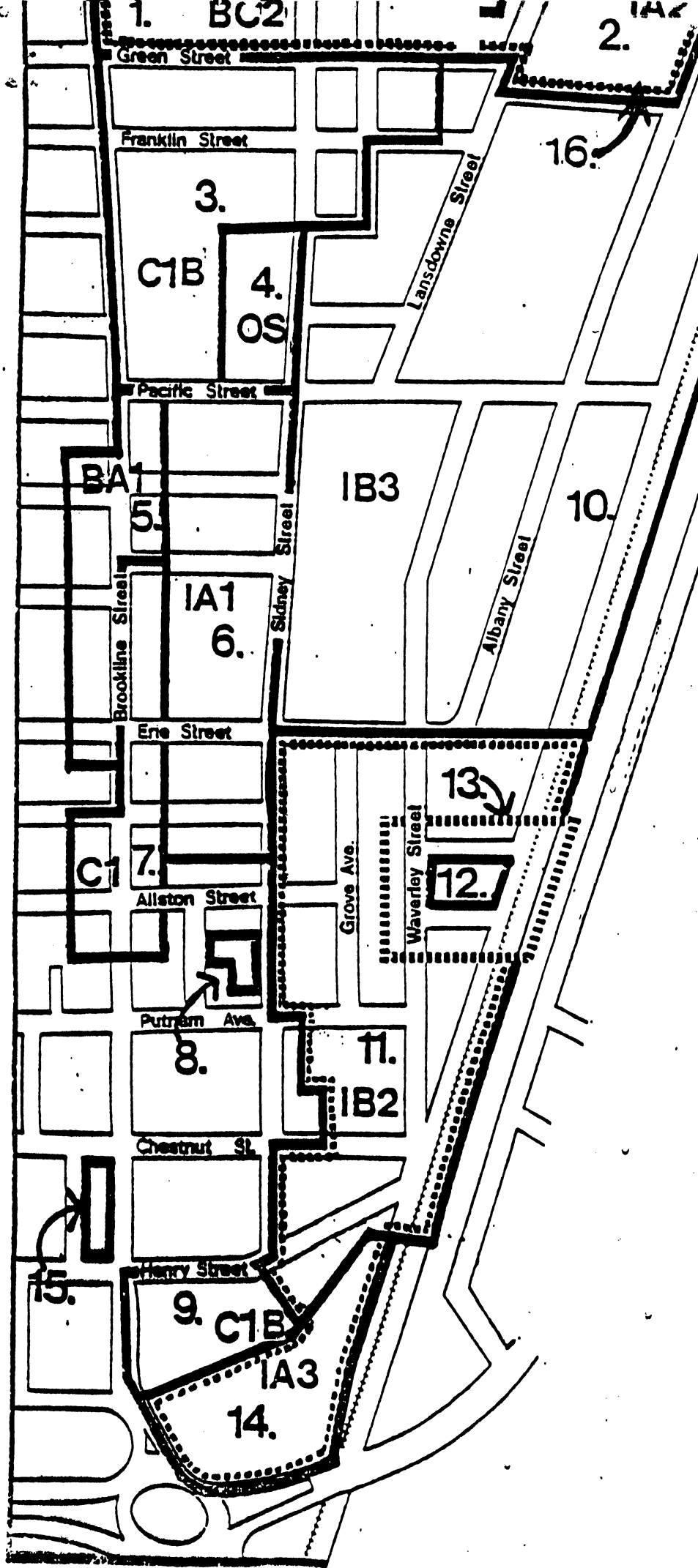
The new Housing Requirement Overlay District mandates the provision of low and moderate income housing simultaneously with the construction of certain commercial developments larger than 20,000 square feet.



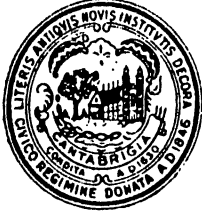

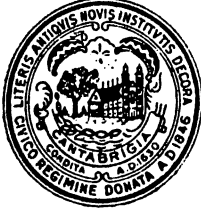

**The Finance Committee**

Comprised of the entire membership of the City Council

*to which* was referred Chapter 296 of the Acts of 1982 which was adopted by vote of the City Council on September 20, 1982; said legislation entitled "An Act Authorizing Cities and Towns to Compensate Their School Committee Members" met on Monday, December 27, 1982 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber for the purpose of setting appropriate compensation for the members of the School Committee under the aforesaid legislation.

Councillor Thomas Danehy, Chairman of the Committee on Finance presided.

Councillor Walter Sullivan moved that the compensation of the members of the School Committee be set at \$10,000. per annum.

Councillor Duehay inquired of the City Manager whether or not there would be any legal problems involved relative to the time element in setting the compensation for the members.

City Manager Robert Healy stated that there were no time constraints that would prevent Council action on the question of compensation.

Councillor David Sullivan stated that there should be a public hearing on the proposed compensation with public notice to all members of the public who might wish to be heard on the subject.

Councillor Duehay inquired as to whether or not it would be possible to pass it to a second reading and schedule a hearing for the general public and inquired from Councillor David Sullivan as to whether this procedure would be agreeable to him.

Councillor David Sullivan indicated that he had no objection to proceeding in this matter.

Councillor Duehay inquired whether it was possible for a member of the School Committee who was also a public employee to draw a salary.

In answer to Councillor Duehay, the City Manager indicated that as a result of a Supreme Court decision, it was decreed that he would have to waive his compensation as a School Committeeman.

Mayor Vellucci inquired as to whether or not an ordinance should be drafted to provide for the compensation for members of the School Committee.

In answer to Mayor Vellucci, City Manager Robert Healy stated that the Council could go either way, by an ordinance amendment, or by adopting an order setting the amount of compensation and that future School budgets will make provision to compensate members of the School Committee.

Mayor Vellucci stated that members of the School Committee had indicated that they would be pleased with the compensation in the amount of \$10,000.; although Committeewoman Jane Sullivan indicated that she believed that she had, in effect entered into a contract to serve with the City without compensation by her election, and that her compensation should be deferred until 1984.

Mayor Vellucci inquired regarding the possibility of a retroactive date for the compensation.

Vice-Mayor Russell stated that he was against any retroactive application of the legislation adopted by the City Council and that the compensation of \$10,000. should be effective as of January 1, 1983.

## AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled: "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge".

*Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:*

That Chapter Two entitled "Administration" is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new Division Four entitled "Compensation for the Members of the School Committee" which reads as follows:

### DIVISION FOUR

#### Section 2-222. COMPENSATION FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Under the authority of Chapter 296 of the Acts of 1982 the elected members of the School Committee shall receive for their annual compensation the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to be paid monthly or weekly.

Chap. 296.        AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS TO  
                         COMPENSATE THEIR SCHOOL COMMITTEE  
                         MEMBERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 52 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 90 of the acts of 1932, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The school committee shall serve without compensation, except that a member of a school committee of a city, town, regional school district or superintendency union may be compensated for his services by a majority vote of the city council in a city having a Plan D or Plan E charter; in a city not having a Plan D or Plan E charter by vote of the city council, subject to the provisions of the charter of such a city; in a town by a majority vote at a town meeting; and in a regional school district or school superintendency by a majority vote of the voting member towns authorized at their respective town meetings, the amount of such compensation, in each case, to be set by the respective cities, towns or groups of towns.
