WHEREAS: The arts and humanities enhance and enrich the lives of all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The arts and humanities affect every aspect of life in America today including the economy, social problem solving, job creation, education, creativity, and community liveability; and

WHEREAS: Local arts agencies across America have joined with the National Assembly of Local Arts Agencies (NALAA), National Assembly of State Arts Agencies and a coalition of over fifty national arts humanities organizations representing over 23,000 cultural organizations to form the National Cultural Alliance to develop a multi-year public awareness campaign on the availability and importance of the humanities and arts to all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The nation's 23,000 cultural organizations, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the nation's 3,800 local arts agencies, the arts and humanities councils of the 50 states and U.S. jurisdictions, and the President of the United States will be encouraged to participate in this celebration and in the public awareness campaign; and

WHEREAS: The month of October has been designed as National Arts and Humanities Month; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council build partnerships with local arts agencies and other members of the arts and humanities community to proclaim, to participate in, and to celebrate the month of October as National Arts and Humanities Month.
