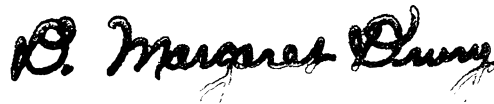

WHEREAS: The Globe Corner Bookstore carries one of North America's largest selections of books and maps for the traveler; and

WHEREAS: The Globe Corner Bookstore provides a full range of travel and outdoor recreation reference materials for a destination, including guidebooks, maps, atlases, recreation guides, travel literature, nature guides, photography books, cookbooks and language products; and

WHEREAS: The Globe Corner Bookstore has been named as Best Specialty Bookstore and Best Bookstore – Travel, by Boston Magazine; and

WHEREAS: In 1995, they launched Globecorner.com, the first American book and map store on the web; and

WHEREAS: They are committed to being a "Green" business, they have recycled cardboard and paper for twenty years and as of 2005, became one of a small number of bookstores worldwide operating in a LEED – certified building, at 90 Mount Auburn Street, which was designed by designed by Leers Weinzapfel Associates Architects of Boston and the interior fit-out, including a state of the art special collections conservation lab, was designed by Alspector Anderson Architects of New York City; now therefore be it
