WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that **Frank Carbonneau** is retiring from his position as the Cambridge Postmaster after six years in this position; and

WHEREAS: After many chronic complaints concerning Postal Service in Cambridge and after much frustration and argument, the U.S. Postal Service established Cambridge as a separate postal district and appointed **Frank Carbonneau** as Postmaster effective July 1991; and

WHEREAS: Under the leadership, supervision and innovation of **Frank Carbonneau**, the 44,000 delivery locations and countless customers visiting Cambridge Postal offices have enjoyed a significant improvement in postal services in recent years; and

WHEREAS: **Frank Carbonneau** wholeheartedly embraced the new concept of working with a Postal Customer Advisory Council; faithfully met monthly with this advisory group, sharing information, listening to complaints, advice and new ideas throughout his six year tenure; and acted positively on suggestions to improve service while also surpassing management revenue and budget goals; and

WHEREAS; **Frank Carbonneau** and the Cambridge Postal personnel have brought to Cambridge a consistent, professional level of performance at the customer service windows, on the delivery routes, and behind the scenes; and

WHEREAS: During these six years, **Postmaster Carbonneau** has often personally attended to complaints; consulted with the universities and business customers; encouraged good humor and respect toward the public; taken considerable care to hire personnel who reflect the make-up of the city population; and

WHEREAS: **Frank Carbonneau** has made sure that this federal agency in our midst was a good Cambridge citizen by encouraging local ceremonial events honoring stamp issues for: the House of Blues; General Benjamin O. Davis; 50th Anniversary of the Marshall Plan speech at Harvard; our own city's 150th Anniversary event; and black history month ceremonies; the dedication of the Central Square Post Office to Clifford Merriman; and by working with the city recycling staff to develop a recycling program for the Cambridge Post Office; and

WHEREAS: Since the position of Cambridge Postmaster is his last post after a 34 year years of dedicated service to the U. S. Postal Service; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record expressing its appreciation to **Frank Carbonneau** for his purposefulness and exceptional dedication to the City of Cambridge and all the customers of postal services within the city and to wish him well in all future endeavors and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested, on behalf of the entire City Council, to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to **Frank Carbonneau** so that it might be presented to him at the reception to be held in his honor at the Cambridge Senior Center on February 24, 1998.
