WHEREAS: Father Murphy, born in Cambridge, graduated from Providence College in 1942 and received a Master's Degree in Sociology from Notre Dame University and a Doctorate in Social Science from the Angelicum in Rome; and

WHEREAS: Father Murphy joined the Providence College faculty in 1957 as Professor of Theology and Chairman of the Sociology Department and at the time of his passing he was serving as Associate Dean of the college's School of Continuing Education; and

WHEREAS: Father Murphy's other positions at the college included stints as Dean of Men, Vice President for Student Relations, Prior of the Dominican Community at the college and Director of the Summer School; and

WHEREAS: Father Murphy also served as a member of the Rhode Island Parole Board from 1981 until shortly before his death; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record attending its deepest sympathy to the family of Reverend James M. Murphy at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
