WHEREAS: His song is still a memory in our hearts, though his music is heard no more; and

WHEREAS: Joseph "Bunny" Smith lived on Hancock Street and played his music all along the establishments of Massachusetts Avenue; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Council recognizes the contributions of Joseph "Bunny" Smith to the spiritual and cultural life of our City, and does hereby memorialize his life by declaring the intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Hancock Street as the Joseph "Bunny" Smith Square; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager make all appropriate arrangements and signage so that the residents of Cambridge recognize Joseph "Bunny" Smith Square.
