In Board of Aldermen, Sept 28 1870

Ordered:

That the usual Order of Notice be issued to the abutters on Elmwood Avenue, that this Board intends to take portions of their estates for the purpose of widening & straightening the lines of said avenue from Brattle to Mount Auburn streets in accordance with plans prepared therefor by the City Engineer & to assess a part of the expense of the same on the estates benefited thereby.

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that Elmwood Avenue from Brattle to Met Auburn St. should be widened on both sides by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, That so much of the land on either side of Elmwood Avenue from Brattle to Met Auburn St. belonging to the persons hereinafter named as is included between the red lines shown on a plan of Elmwood Avenue drawn by J. F. Chase City Engineer dated Nov. 30th 1870 and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public way and a part of said Elmwood Avenue

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken and for the removal of the buildings, walls, fences and other property standing thereon so taken be estimated, and awarded as follows.
