WHEREAS:-

Charles H. McGlue was closely identified with the political life of the Commonwealth for more than half a century serving as a representative to the State House from Lynn in the year 1914-1915 prior to his service as Democratic Chairman for Massachusetts during the 1924-1934 era.

WHEREAS:-

Charles H. McGlue gained his greatest fame for his role in rewriting election laws and won great recognition for his expertise on the subject of recounts and attained the stature of a Senior Statesman on Beacon Hill and earned the respect of all who sought his assistance

WHEREAS:-

In his passing the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the City of Cambridge has lost a dedicated lovable personality whose presence enriched the political life of this State

That the City Council of the City of Cambridge in regular session assembled on this sixth day of November, 1972 does hereby record its deepest regret at the untimely passing of Attorney Charles H. McGlue and joins with his family and friends in sorrow over their great loss.
