ORDERED:

That His Honor the Mayor be authorized to sign a petition to the Land Court for the registration, in the name of the City, of a certain parcel of land situated on Mt. Auburn St., Cambridge, bounded and described as follows:-

Northerly by land of the Fitchburg Railroad Company and by land of the West End Railway Company, one hundred and six and 38/100 (106.38) feet.

Westerly by land of the Fitchburg Railroad, forty-three and 80/100 (43.80) feet.

Southerly by Mt. Auburn St., one hundred and thirty-two and 78/100 (132.78) feet.

Containing 2,054 square feet as shown on "Plan of Land on Mt. Auburn St. for Land Court Registration, dated April 25, 1921, L. H. Hastings, City Engineer".
