# City of Cambridge

In the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty four,

## An Ordinance

In relation to the posting or printing of Notices, Placards and Advertisements.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:-

Sec. 1. No person shall print, post up or affix in any manner, any bill, placard, notice, advertisement, words or figures, upon the fences, walls, or any part of any building in the City of Cambridge, without the previous consent of the occupants, or, if there be no occupants, without the previous consent of the owners thereof; nor upon any part of any fence or building belonging to the City of Cambridge without the previous consent of the Mayor.

Sec. 2. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding fifty dollars for each offence.
