

In the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty two
An Ordinance
Establishing the Salaries of certain City Officers

Be it ordained, by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows;—

1. The officers of the City, hereinafter
named, shall receive the following annual
salaries, to be paid in equal quarterly pay-
ments, which shall be in full for all
services rendered in their official capacity, viz.

City Treasurer and Collector, Seven hundred Dollars;
City Clerk, exclusive of fees established by
Law, Seven hundred Dollars;

Auditor of Accounts,

Clerk of Common Council, One hundred Dollars;

Board of Assessors, Eight hundred Dollars;

City Messenger, Three hundred Dollars;

Superintendent of Streets, Six hundred Dollars;

Chief Engineer, Two hundred Dollars;

Three Assistant Engineers, Fifty Dollars each;

Three Head Constables, One hundred Dollars each;

2. All ordinances, or part, of ordinances, incon-
sistent with the foregoing, are hereby repealed.—
