IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL DEPARTMENTS

REDEPOSIT OF REFUND NO LONGER MANDATORY FOR ANY FORMER EMPLOYEE WHO RETURNS TO WORK WITHIN A TWO YEAR PERIOD

Section 3 of Chapter 32 of the Massachusetts General Laws has been amended by Chapter 630 of the Acts of 1982.

Any former member of the Retirement System who is reinstated to or who re-enters the active service of the governmental unit in which he was formerly employed to serve in a position which is subject to the provisions of Chapter 32, within two years from the date of his separation therefrom, MAY again become a member in service if under the maximum age for his group and MAY pay into the annuity savings fund of the particular system in one make-up sum, or in installments upon such terms and conditions as the Board may prescribe, an amount equal to the accumulated regular deductions which were withdrawn by him, together with the regular interest to the date of re-employment.

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 28F, no such member shall be eligible for disability benefits until such repayment is made to the system.

Upon making such make-up payment such member shall be entitled to all creditable service resulting from his previous employment.
