In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-two

An Ordinance
in addition to the Ordinance in relation to
the Fire Department.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. The Ordinance in relation to the
Fire Department is amended in section first,
second line, by inserting after the word,
"Engineers" the word, "Boatmen"; in
section third, first line, by expunging the
word "other" and inserting the word,
"Assistant", and in the third line of
the same section, by inserting after the
word "and" the word "Assistant"; in section
fourth, tenth line, by inserting after the
word "Engines" the word "Boats"; in section
ninth, first line, by inserting after the
word "each" the word "board"; in section
twenty-ninth, by striking out the words
"semi-annually to each member" and
inserting the words "monthly to the

Engineer and Driver of Steam Fire Engines
and serve annually to other members."

Sec. 2. Said Ordinance is further amended
by adding the following sections. -

Sec. 39. Each Steam Fire Engine company
appointed by the Mayor and Aldermen
shall consist of fourteen men, and
shall have a Foreman, Assistant Foreman,
Engineer, Fireman, Driver, and nine
Hosemen. The Foreman and Assistant
Foreman shall be chosen by ballot,
subject to the approval of the Board of
Engineers, and of the Mayor and Aldermen,
and any person rejected shall not be re-
turned the second time for approval.
The Engineer and Driver shall be con-
stantly employed, and shall at all
times be in or about the Engine House,
except when unavoidably absent.

Sec. 40. The Foreman of each Steam Engine
company shall at times direct the lo-
cating of the engine, and have charge
and direction of the hosemen.

Sec. 41. The Assistant Foreman of each
Steam Engine company shall assist the
foreman in the discharge of his duties.

and also act as Clerk of said company.

Sec. 42. The Engineer of each Steam Engine company shall, under the direction of the Board of Engineers have the sole care of the engine, house and all the property therein belonging to the City. He shall be held personally responsible for the care and condition of the Engine, shall work the same, and have it at all times ready for immediate use. He shall be accountable for the proper performance of all duties required of the Driver and Fireman, and make report to the Chief Engineer of any neglect on their part.

Sec. 43. The Driver of each Steam Engine company shall drive, and have charge of the horse, and have the same at all times ready for immediate use, and the stable kept neat and clean. He shall also assist the Engineer in keeping the house and apparatus clean, and both Engineer and Driver shall perform such other duties as may be required of them by the Chief Engineer.
