- WHEREAS: The City Council has authorized the City Manager to apply for funding from the Urban Self-Help Program sponsored by the Executive Office of Environmental Affairs and the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund to renovate St. Peter's Field and Roethlisberger Park; and
- WHEREAS: The renovation of these two sites for both active and passive recreation will complement the range of activities to be provided at the proposed Thomas W. Danehy Park; and
- WHEREAS: Open space is a rare and precious commodity in an urban environment as densely-populated as Cambridge; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council goes on record to confirm that St. Peter's Field and Roethlisberger Park have been and will continue to be permanently dedicated as open space for the purpose of recreational activities.
