

Proposed City Council
resolution supporting telethon for El Salvador Sister City Project

WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council established a Sister City relationship with San Jose Las Flores, El Salvador, in March 1987 and

WHEREAS: 7 delegations of Cambridge residents have visited San Jose Las Flores, bringing food, medicine and school supplies; and Cambridge residents have provided some measure of protection for the villagers from the Salvadoran military; and

WHEREAS: The most recent delegation returned in January 1990 to report that the villagers have received no visitors, food or medicine since October, 1989 and are experiencing severe health and nutrition problems and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council, local clergy and community leaders have deplored the assassination of the six Jesuit Priests, their housekeeper and her daughter in November, 1989 and have called for an end to US military assistance and a negotiated settlement of the conflict in El Salvador and

WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge have become aware of the problems and possible solutions to end the injustice in El Salvador through our relationship with the people in San Jose Las Flores, and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has always made a special effort to help its Sister Cities in times of need; therefore be it

RESOLVED: The Cambridge City Council endorses the proposal from the Cambridge-El Salvador Sister City Project that the City's Cable TV office co-produce a telethon on April 4, 1990 to raise money for humanitarian aid for the people of San Jose las Flores in this time of crisis.
