- WHEREAS: The Department of the Interior has recognized the significance of the Central Square Historic District to the history of Cambridge through listing of the district on the National Register of Historic Places; and
- WHEREAS: National Register listing is an honor reflecting Central Square's importance as Cambridge's downtown, a hub of transportation, the seat of local government, and the center of Cambridgeport commerce; and
- WHEREAS: Central Square has been the traditional center of business and commerce in the City of Cambridge and the National Register listing serves as both a recognition of the past and a beacon toward a promising future; and
- WHEREAS: The Honorable Michael J. Connolly, Secretary of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and Chairman of the Massachusetts Historical Commission, will present a certificate of listing to the City of Cambridge on January 29, 1991; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulates the Central Square Association for its commitment to recognizing this area's past and contributing to its future growth; and further be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Carl Barron, President of the Central Square Association, and to Charles Sullivan, Executive Director of the Cambridge Historical Commission.
