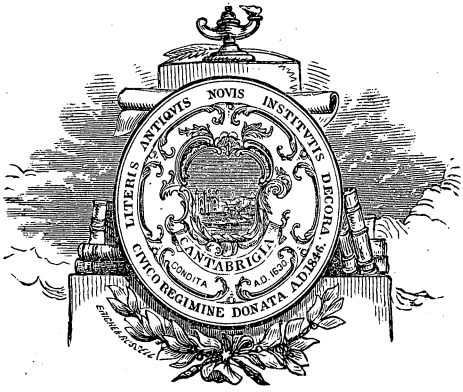




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

Dec. 30 1885.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Fulton Street*, so-called extending from Dublin Street, westerly about Three Hundred and Eighty five feet, more or less; thence northerly about Two Hundred and Sixty feet, more or less; and thence easterly to Dublin Street,

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *twenty five* feet in width between *the points hereinbefore named,*

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *W.A. Mason* & Son, Surveyors, - dated *November 9th. 1885,*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, (all the owners of abutting lands except one, have agreed in writing to claim no damages on account of such taking, and the said owner have also filed a bond to save the city harmless from any claim for damages on the part of the remaining owner)
