WHEREAS:

His Excellency John A. Volpe, Governor of the Commonwealth, has by proclamation set aside Saturday, August 26, 1961, as Susan B. Anthony Day, and

WHEREAS:

Susan B. Anthony, by her efforts, did so much to secure for women the right to vote, to an education, to practice a profession, to obtain wages as high as those paid to men for the same work, and

WHEREAS:

The practical idealism, sense of justice and social responsibility which characterized Susan B. Anthony, make her an example of good citizenship for women and men alike;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council take notice of this day and recommend its observance in honor of the woman who was an ardent advocate of American woman suffrage.
