- WHEREAS: Mrs. Berg, a Belmont native and graduate of its local schools, as well as the Garland School in Boston, was the retired assistant to the minister of the First Parish Unitarian-Universalist Church in Cambridge, working in that capacity for twenty-two years, retiring in 1979; and
- WHEREAS: Mrs. Berg was not only an active participant and leader in Church affairs, but was also deeply involved with the Personal Book Shop, and for a time was a secretary to Dr. Paul H. Means; and
- WHEREAS: Mrs. Berg was extremely well known in the Cambridge community, particularly around Harvard Square, for her religious and civic activities which she so richly enjoyed; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to our colleague Frank and Mrs. Berg's brother Ellis H. Dennett and stepdaughter Barbara G. Granat, at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council
