MAYOR REEVES

- WHEREAS:** Cambridge strives to be a city where businesses can thrive alongside with happy residents, whose concerns for the quality of life is most important; and
- WHEREAS:** Cambridge's limited parking availability often pose great difficulty for business people, plumbers, lawyers, doctors, electricians, insurers, and others, who must travel about the city to conduct business; and
- WHEREAS:** Many letters and calls from the business community to the Mayor's office regarding this parking issue, raise the concern that the City should do more to help alleviate this parking problem for businesses which depend on travel and parking throughout Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS:** Small businesses have chosen to invest in our city and not others, bringing vital tax revenue, and jobs to to the benefit of Cambridge residents; and
- WHEREAS:** Failure to respond quickly and adequately to this problem for the businesses in Cambridge will result in customers not served, and business people not assisted in this most difficult of times; now, therefore, be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager, through his Traffic and Parking Department, be and is hereby requested to devise a plan and report back in two weeks of a plan to provide access to parking in Cambridge for business people who do not live in Cambridge, but own and operate businesses in the City of Cambridge.
