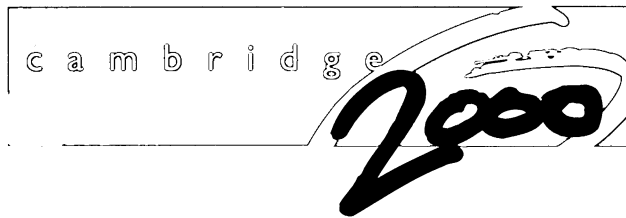

To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$675,262.38 in State Chapter 90 Funds to the Public Investment Fund Public Works Extraordinary Expenditures account. When the FY00 Capital Budget was prepared, it was estimated that the City would receive \$2,000,000 in Chapter 90 funds based on previous years' experience. Please see pages V-24 to V-25 of the FY00 Budget for additional information. However, when the State budget was approved, the statewide Chapter 90 allocation had been reduced from \$150 million to \$50 million with the City's share lowered from \$2,000,000 to \$650,000. At that time, the City Council rescinded the appropriation to reflect the decrease in funding. A subsequent amendment to the State budget increased Chapter 90 funding to \$100 million with Cambridge receiving an additional \$675,262.38. This request will appropriate these funds for the reconstruction of Inman Street from Inman Square to Broadway, Little Massachusetts Avenue from Waterhouse Street to Massachusetts Avenue, and Holworthy Street from Mt. Auburn Street to Huron Avenue.
