- WHEREAS: Parking in East Cambridge for residents is always difficult even with the City's Resident Parking Sticker Program;
- WHEREAS: On September 11, 1990, the CambridgeSide Galleria Mall will open bringing thousand of additional cars into East Cambridge on a daily basis; and
- WHEREAS: Parking at the CambridgeSide Mall garage will not be free and many drivers will try to park in East Cambridge, further exacerbating an already bad parking problem; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Traffic & Parking Director with the view in mind of considering for implementation the following:
- That the Resident Parking Program be in force every day, including Sunday, from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. in an area bound by Sciarapa Street, Binney Street, First Street, and the Somerville line;
- That enforcement of the Resident Parking Program in all of East Cambridge be doubled through December 31, 1990, at which time the Commissioner of Traffic & Parking will present the City Council with a report on the effect of the CambridgeSide Mall on traffic and parking in East Cambridge; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be requested to meet with the owners of CambridgeSide Mall to determine whether cars with Cambridge Resident Parking Stickers can park free in the CambridgeSide Mall garage; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be requested to instruct the Commissioner of Traffic & Parking to examine the Boston Resident Parking Sticker Program to determine whether a neighborhood based resident parking program can be implemented in Cambridge and to report back to the City Council on this matter by October 31, 1990.
