On Thursday, August 29, 1975, five heavily armed men heldup the University Trust Company in North Cambridge and left with \$9,000.00 of the bank receipts, and

WHEREAS:

The Cambridge Police Department responding quickly to the bank alarm pursued the perpetrators of this crime and working closely with the Arlington Police Department, Belmont Police Department and the Airborne State Police Department succeeded in apprehending the five suspects at gunpoint in the Acorn Park and Rindge Avenue area of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:

This outstanding example of police work was made possible by the well coordinated efforts of the Arlington Police, Belmont Police and the State Police Departments and the dedication to duty displayed by the members of these departments, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record congratulating all officers of the Cambridge Police Department who assisted in any way in the apprehension of these criminals, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That particular thanks be given to Sergeant Domenic Scàlese, Sergeant Ronald Briand, Sergeant Walter Boyle, Patrolman Joseph Cherubino and Patrolman Joseph Correia for their heroic efforts in the face of great personal danger, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That a copy of this resolution be read at roll call and individual copies be presented to the officers and the departments concerned and appropriate reference be made in their files to record for all time their actions which were in keeping with the best and highest traditions of law enforcement.
