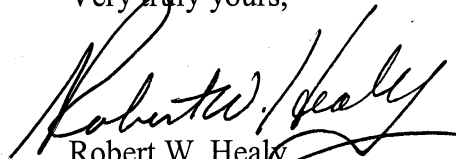
To The Honorable, The City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 01-181, regarding a report on the status of constructing a skate park, Assistant City Manager for Community Development Beth Rubenstein and Assistant City Manager for Human Services Jill Herold report the following:

An in-house team comprised of Greg Garber from the Department of Public Works, Rob Steck from the Community Development Department and Paul Ryder from the Department of Human Services, Recreation have visited both pre-fabricated and site designed skate parks in Andover, Stoneham and Winchester. In addition, Paul Ryder has met with a group of interested Cambridge youth in order to get their feedback on the establishment of a skate park in Cambridge.

The next step in this process will be to formalize a committee to research and assess the feasibility of locating a skate park in the City. As part of the analysis, various possible sites will be identified and evaluated. The analysis will also include a look at physical layout, liability issues, noise and other factors that will go into any siting. Based the analysis, the committee will prepare a report for your review on recommended sites, schematic design and cost analysis.
