As a Cambridge taxpayer and a practicing Cambridge physician, I want to express my objection to your utilizing City of Cambridge resources to promote the introduction of the Harvard Community Health Plan for the citizens and employees of Cambridge in its many guises.

As you are well aware, the citizens of Cambridge built and support a thirteen million dollar hospital and the salaries of sixty-seven physicians for the purpose of providing health care. In spite of this monetary outlay, we are told that we need a health plan to improve the health condition of the city, and Harvard University will plan and control it.

In addition, several of these full-time city physicians for the past two years have utilized telephone service, office space, parking space and secretarial services to promote their plan.

In my opinion the Harvard Community Health Plan should reimburse the City of Cambridge for use of its facilities for the past two years at the going rate - and cease and desist their magnanimous plans at the taxpayers' expense.
