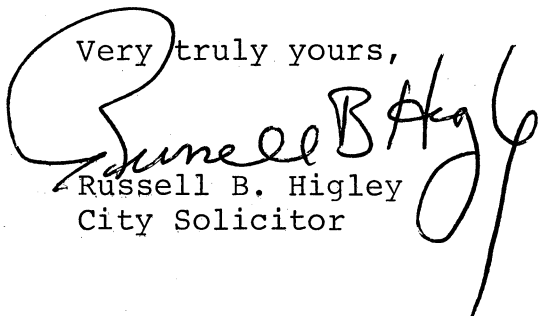
Dear Mr. Healy:

Relative to Council Order #28 dated September 28, 1981, please be advised that I referred this matter to the Health and Building Departments. I met with Lt. 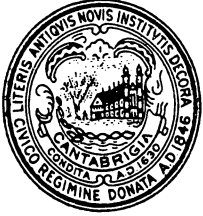
Upon reinspection of the property, it was noted to be free of motor vehicles and the lot was in a clean state.
